Best Practice-I

1. Title of the Practice

Mega Blood Donation Camp

2. Objectives of the Practice

To actively contribute to community welfare by collecting 56 blood units and exemplifying the NCC's commitment to saving lives and fostering a sense of community service.

3. The Context

Maharana Pratap Govt.College Amb organized a blood donation camp on the occasion of the 75th NCC Day. In this camp the cadets of Govt. College Amb along with cadets Govt. College Dhaliara and Govt. College Daulatpur donated blood. It was started with a donation of blood by the principal of Govt. College Amb Dr Raman Kumar Sharma. Sergeant Sunil Kumar and Ajay from NCC Unit Una also participated in it to motivate more and more students. Dr. Sucharita Lath was the chairman of 5 members team from Regional Hospital Una.

4. The Practice

In celebration of the NCC's 75th anniversary, a Mega Blood Donation Camp was meticulously orchestrated by NCC Cadets in November, aligning with NCC Day. The event, held at the Block Development Office in Amb, prioritized safety amid Vidhan Sabha elections. Collaborating with doctors from Regional Hospital Una, the NCC 6 HP(I) Coy Una ensured the camp's efficiency. Cadets from Government College Dalulatur Chowank and Government College Dhaliyara also actively participated.

5. Evidence of Success

The effort resulted in the selfless donation of 56 blood units, underscoring the camp's success and its impactful contribution to community welfare.

6. Problems Encountered and Resources Required

Over 30 NCC Cadets and college students, expressing interest in blood donation were ineligible due to not meeting the requisite age criterion of 18 years for blood donation. There was a lack of awareness among the students about blood donation. There were misconceptions about the donation of blood among students. Few students were anaemic and underweight

Throughout the camp, NCC Cadets actively engaged with the local public and government officials, providing motivation and awareness about the blood donation



initiative. This concerted effort resulted in the collection of 56 units of blood during the camp.
