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Parent Satisfaction Survey Report 2022-23

Introduction:

This report presents the findings of the Parent Satisfaction Survey conducted to gather feedback on various aspects of our institution. The survey aimed to assess parents' opinions on academic activities, equal opportunities, teaching methodologies, infrastructure, and overall satisfaction with the college.

Survey Methodology:

The survey was distributed to parents electronically, and responses were collected anonymously. The survey consisted of 13 questions covering different aspects of the college experience, with respondents providing feedback on a scale ranging from "Never" to "Outstanding."

Key Findings:

1. Academic Activities:

- 74% of parents reported asking their wards about academic activities regularly.
- 66% believe their wards are receiving equal opportunities in all academic activities.

2. Performance in Academics:

- 80% expressed satisfaction with their wards' academic performance.
- 62% find internal evaluations to be usually fair.

3. Online Teaching during COVID Era:

• 78% are satisfied with the efforts made by faculty members for online teaching during the COVID era.

4. Teaching Methodologies:

70% are satisfied with the teaching methodologies adopted by the faculty.

5. Cultural and Extra Co-curricular Activities:

- 68% believe their wards get equal opportunities in all types of cultural and extra cocurricular activities.
- 75% are satisfied with their wards' performance in these activities.

6. Infrastructure and Learning Environment:

- 82% agree that the college provides adequate infrastructure and a proper learning environment.
- 76% agree that the college provides a clean and healthy learning environment.

7. Library and Access to Resources:

• 64% confirmed their wards have proper access to the library, books, and journals.

8. Administrative Staff:

• 58% expressed satisfaction with the public dealing of administrative staff.

9. **Overall Rating:**

• The overall rating of the institution was positive, with 65% rating it as "Excellent" and 28% as "Outstanding."

Conclusion:

The survey indicates a generally positive sentiment among parents regarding various aspects of the college. While there are areas of satisfaction, there are also some areas where improvements can be made, particularly in the fairness of internal evaluations and public dealing of administrative staff. The feedback provided will be instrumental in continuous efforts to enhance the overall college experience for students and their parents.






1. Are you asking from your ward about academic activities in the college. ³⁶ responses



2. Is your ward getting equal opportunity in all the academic activities in the college? ^{36 responses}




3. Are you satisfied with the performance of your ward in academics? ^{36 responses}




4. Fairness in the internal evaluation of your ward by the teachers.




5. Are you satisfied with the efforts made by our faculty members for online teaching during COVID era?




6. Are you satisfied with the teaching methodologies adopted by our teaching faculty. ³⁶ responses




7. Is your ward getting equal opportunity in all types of cultural and extra co-curricular activities in the college?




8. Are you satisfied with the performance of your ward in cultural and extra co-curricular activities? ^{36 responses}




9. Do you agree with the statement that our college is providing adequate infrastructure and proper learning environment to all the students?




10. Do you agree with the statement that our college is providing clean and healthy learning environment to all the students?



11. Is your ward getting proper access of Library, Books and Journal in the college? ³⁶ responses




12. Are you satisfied with the public dealing of administrative staff of the college? ³⁶ responses
