- 57% are satisfied with the efforts made by faculty members for online teaching.

#### **4. Teaching Methodologies:**

- 48% are satisfied with the teaching methodologies adopted by the faculty.

#### **5. Cultural and Extra-Co-curricular Activities:**

- 52% believe their wards get equal opportunities in all types of cultural and extracurricular activities.
- 45% are satisfied with their wards' performance in these activities.

#### **6. Infrastructure and Learning Environment:**

- 48% agree that the college provides adequate infrastructure and a proper learning environment.
- 52% agree that the college provides a clean and healthy learning environment.

#### **7. Library and Access to Resources:**

- 60% confirmed their wards have proper access to the library, books, and journals.

- 55% expressed satisfaction with the public dealing of administrative staff.

**9. Overall Rating:**

- The overall rating of the institution was positive, with 17% rating it as “Excellent” and 50% as “Outstanding.”

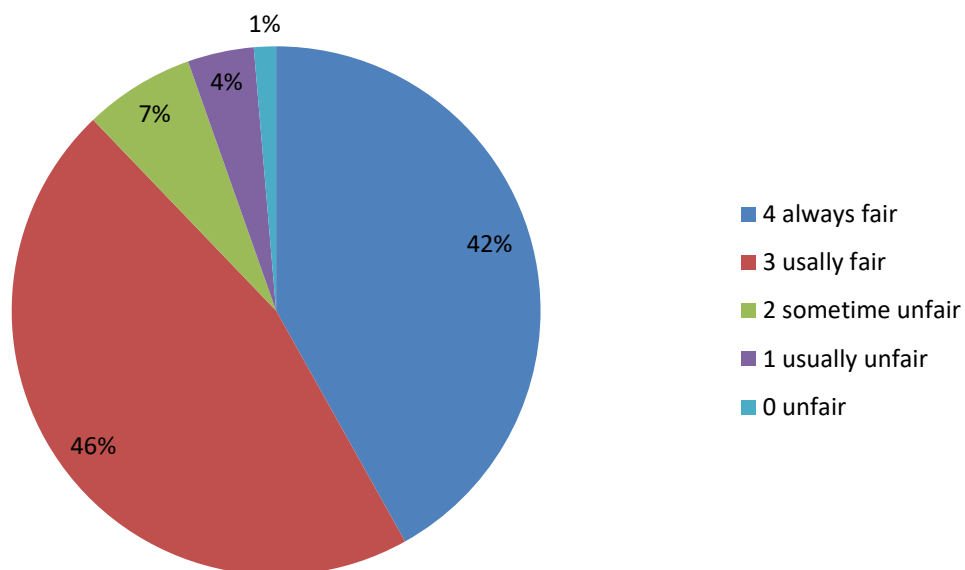

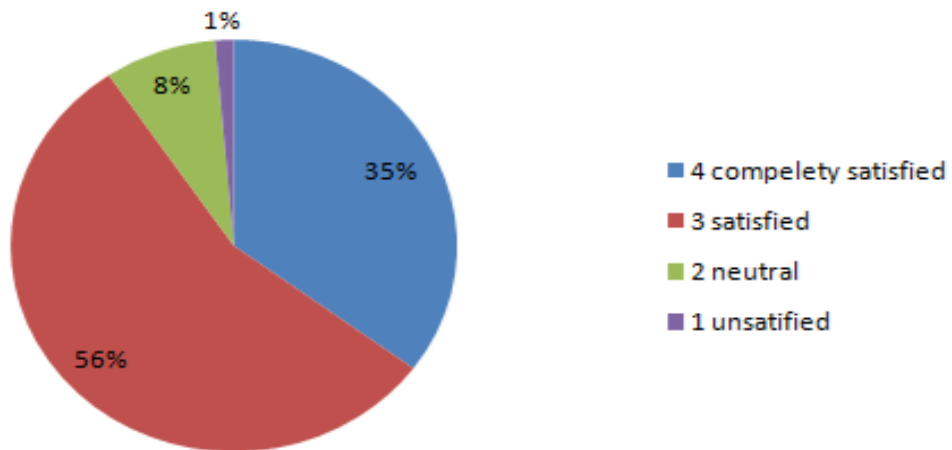
