ABOUT US

This college was started in 1970 as National College Amb by Late Sh. Hans Raj Akrot, a prominent citizen of this area to provide Higher Education to the students of this area. It was taken over by HP Govt. in 1997 and renamed as Maharana Pratap Govt. Degree College, Amb with about 400 students in Arts & Science (Non-Medical) streams. Commerce stream was started in 2002, Medical stream was started in 2009 and Self-Finance courses in 2010. M.A. in English was introduced in 2002 and M.Com. in 2017. The college was inspected by NAAC Team in 2006 and was awarded C grade. In 2016, after second inspection by NAAC, we were awarded grade B with CGPA 2.4. In 2025, after third inspection (V-PTV) by NAAC, we were again awarded grade B with CGPA 2.31. On 6th December 2021, our college was upgraded as Uttkrisht Mahavidyalaya. Our college has also been awarded with the status of "Institution of Excellence". The present set up of college is a result of the persistent efforts of staff & students and regular support from the people of the area and the Government.

Digital Library

Thirty All-in-One (AIO) computers and twenty tablets have been purchased for the benefit of the students. Furthermore, sixty chairs and ten tables have been procured to enhance the seating capacity of the Digital Library

Under the able leadership of Prof. Amit Kumar Sharma (Coordinator-IQAC) and Dr. Krishna Sharma (Assistant Coordinator-IQAC), the college IQAC cell is performing remarkable job for quality assurance and assessment. The milestones achieved by IQAC in the current session are listed below:

01. NAAC V-PTV (Virtual Peer Team Visit) and Reaccreditation

The NAAC Virtual Peer Team Visit (V-PTV) for reaccreditation of the institution was conducted on 8th and 9th May 2025. During the visit, the institution virtually presented all academic, administrative, and infrastructural aspects before the Peer Team.

The institution achieved a notable distinction by becoming the first and only institution in Himachal Pradesh to undergo NAAC reaccreditation through the Virtual Mode. The NAAC Peer Team highly appreciated the dedicated efforts of the Internal Quality Assurance Cell (IQAC) in successfully coordinating the entire reaccreditation process. The team also acknowledged and commended the active cooperation and coordination among the faculty members, students, Parent-Teacher Association (PTA), and Old Students' Association (OSA).

After two days of continuous interactions, presentations, and the submission of all required clarifications and documents as sought by the NAAC Peer Team, the institution successfully retained its previous NAAC grade and was reaccredited with a Grade 'B'. The institution is now accredited by NAAC up to 18 May 2030.

This achievement is the outcome of the consistent and dedicated efforts made by the institution over the past five years towards maintaining and enhancing quality in teaching, learning, research, and institutional governance.

The Seven-Day NSS Special Camp was organized in the adopted village Upper Andora. Volunteers conducted:


- Cleanliness drives in the village and Baba Pindi Dass Ashram






02. Celebration of International Women's Day

03. National Sports Day Celebrations – 28th to 29th August 2025



04. Awareness Campaign for Drivers





“Our library remains the heart of academic learning, providing valuable resources that inspire knowledge, research, and lifelong learning.”




DEMANDS


